Title: Commissioning Intentions 2016/17

1. Purpose of Report

This report sets out the background, purpose and objectives of a joint meeting of Adult Social Care, Health and Wellbeing Sub-Committee and the Health and Wellbeing Board to consider the North Tyneside Council's and North Tyneside Clinical Commissioning Group's commissioning intentions for 2016/17.

2. Recommendations

The sub-committee is recommended:

- 1 to consider North Tyneside Council's and North Tyneside Clinical Commissioning Group's commissioning intentions for health, social care and wellbeing 2016/17; and
- 2 if the sub-committee does not wish to make any recommendations, that they note the commissioning intentions.

3. Information

On an annual basis North Tyneside Council and North Tyneside Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) present to the Adult Social Care, Health and Wellbeing Sub-committee their respective commissioning intentions for the year ahead. This year it has been agreed that in order to avoid duplication, the intentions will be presented and considered jointly with the Health and Wellbeing Board.

Following the presentations members of the both bodies will be invited to ask questions and consider the proposals. It should be noted that the two bodies will do so with different, but complementary, objectives in mind.

The Sub-Committee, in exercising its scrutiny functions will wish to consider the commissioning intentions in relation to health, social care and wellbeing and the impact these will have on services. The sub-committee may make recommendations to the

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Elected Mayor, Cabinet and partner organisations to support them in the formulation of their future plans, strategies and decision making.

The Board have a lawful power to consider whether the commissioning intentions take proper account of the Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy and Joint Strategic Needs Assessment and it may give its opinion to the CCG and Council if it so wishes. The Board has also previously indicated that it wishes to examine how financial and other resources are being utilised; and sometimes re-directed, to reflect the Board's shared priorities.
