1. Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to provide an update on the work of the Older Person's Mental Health Sub-group up to now and the next steps.

2. Recommendations

The sub-committee are asked to:

- 1) Note the progress made up to now and the next steps; and
- 2) Give approval for the sub-group to provide feedback in relation to the new service specification for the Memory Support Service prior to the completion of the study.

3. Details

- 3.1 As part of the Adult Social Care, Health and Wellbeing Sub-committee work programme 2016/17, Members agreed to establish a sub-group to carry out a study of older person's mental health services in North Tyneside.
- 3.2 As outlined in the scope (which is attached at Appendix A), the main focus of the study was to examine the support and services for people with dementia or Alzheimer's, their family members and carers, particularly for those who are living at home.
- 3.3 The sub-group currently comprises:

3.4 On the 25 July 2016, the sub-group had its first meeting with officers from the Council's Adult Social Care and North Tyneside Clinical Commissioning Group. At this meeting the sub-group received background information relating to services in North Tyneside for people with dementia and Alzheimer's and agreed the scope of the study.

- 3.5 At the initial meeting the sub-group were also informed that the contract for the Memory Support Service in North Tyneside was due to expire and be re-commissioned. It was therefore suggested that one of the objectives of the review would be to add value to the work relating to the review of the Memory Support Service and the new specification for the service by the end of September 2016. Due to the tight timescale the sub-group are required to feed back its comments /suggestions about the new service specification for the Memory Support Services to officers at a meeting on the 20 September 2016, as this will be before the review is completed the sub-group seeks approval from the sub-committee to do this.
- 3.6 A number of consultation sessions with people with dementia and their carers, were arranged by Adult Social Care and members of the sub-group have attended these sessions. This has allowed the sub-group to hear first hand service user's experiences and views of community support services. The evidence gathered from these sessions will not only be invaluable in shaping the new Memory Support Service but also for the wider study.
- 3.7 The sub-group also plan to meet with service providers including the Memory Support Service, Northumbria Healthcare Foundation Trust and Northumberland, Tyne and Wear Foundation Trust.
- 3.8 If anyone is interested in joining the sub-group at this stage or would like more information about the work of the sub-group contact the Democratic Services Officer.
