4th objection: It is such a small area any building would cause density the layout and design is literally squashing whatever is possible with no regards to neighbours, security to the rear of our propery would be an issue and since the road is to be put in at the bottom of our gardens dangerous if a child were to run along our driveway straight onto the road.

5th objection: The loss of open aspect to our neighbourhood.

6th objection: The loss of community space.

7th objection: Infrastructure, roads ,schools, drainage etc

8th objection: Additional noise or disturbance resulting from the end use
