1.1 Purpose:

The purpose of this report is to present the recommendations of the Permit Parking Subgroup in relation to its study of permit parking in North Tyneside.

- 1.5.2 Members held a series of evidence gathering meetings with Council Officers, the Council's technical partner, Capita, and local residents and business representatives. The findings can be found in the full report attached at Appendix 1.
- 1.5.3 The report contains 18 recommendation aimed at implementing a simplified, more consistent and more effective permit system.

Option 1

Cabinet may accept the recommendation set out in paragraph 1.2 above.

Cabinet may not accept the recommendation set out in paragraph 1.2 above.

Option 3

Cabinet may accept part of the recommendation as set out in paragraph 1.2 above and reject the rest.

Option 1 is the recommended option.

Cabinet has a statutory duty to respond to the Overview, Scrutiny and Policy Development Committee's recommendations within 2 months of receiving them. Option 1 is recommended as this option allows Cabinet time to consider and formulate a response to the recommendations.
