1.1 Purpose:

The purpose of this report is to present the observations and opinion of the Overview, Scrutiny & Policy Development Committee in relation to its study into the future of the Kier North Tyneside Joint Venture Company (KNT JVCo) partnership and options to what delivery models should be considered post 31 March 2019 when the current 10 year contract ends.

In accordance with Section 122 of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007, Cabinet is required to provide a response to the recommendations of the Overview, Scrutiny and Policy Development Committee within two months. In providing this response Cabinet is asked to state whether or not it accepts each of the recommendations and the reasons for this decision. 1.2 Recommendation(s):

It is recommended that Cabinet considers instructing officers to undertake further detailed appraisal of each of the 3 options selected and that the Scrutiny Sub-group determines as the most appropriate future options available and to have regard to the concerns raised within the report.

1.5 Information:

Background information

- 1.5.1 As part of the Overview, Scrutiny & Policy Development Committee programme 2015/16, Members agreed to establish a sub-group to carry out a study to the possible options available for the future Construction Options for North Tyneside when the current 10 year partnership with Kier North Tyneside Limited (KNT) is due to end.
- 1.5.2 Members held a series of evidence gathering meetings with Council Officers, Kier North Tyneside Senior Management, Tenant Representatives and Union Officials between October 2015 and May 2016. The findings can be found in the full report attached at Appendix 1.
- 1.5.3 The findings of the study resulted in the selection of 3 options the sub-group believes should undergo full appraisal on their viability of possible future options for the Council.

1.5 Decision options:

The following decision options are available for consideration by Cabinet:

Option 1

Cabinet may accept the recommendation set out in paragraph 1.2 above.

Option 2

Cabinet may not accept the recommendation set out in paragraph 1.2 above.

Option 3

Cabinet may accept part of the recommendation as set out in paragraph 1.2 above and reject the rest.

Option 1 is the recommended option.

1.6 Reasons for recommended option:

Cabinet has a statutory duty to respond to the Overview, Scrutiny and Policy Development Committee's recommendations within 2 months of receiving them. Option 1 is recommended as this option allows Cabinet time to consider and formulate a response to the recommendations.
