## PART 1

#### 1.1 **Purpose:**

The purpose of the report is to request Council to consider and agree, the proposal attached in the Appendix to change the location of one polling place.

#### 1.2 Recommendation(s):

It is recommended that Council consider and agree:

The alternative location for the polling place in Polling District CD in Longbenton ward as set out in the Appendix.

#### **Forward Plan:** 1.3

Twenty eight days notice of this report has been given and it first appeared on the Forward Plan that was published on 27 October 2014.

#### 1.4 **Council Plan and Policy Framework**

This report does not specifically relate to any of the priorities contained in the 2014 - 18 Our North Tyneside Plan.

#### Information: 1.5

Under the current elections legislation, the Council is required to designate a polling place for each polling district within its area and also to keep such polling places under review.

To encourage and facilitate voter participation, all electors should have reasonable facilities in which to vote. The Electoral Commission recommends that the following factors are taken into consideration when reviewing existing polling places or when assessing new polling places:

- The location: is it reasonably accessible within the polling district? Does it avoid barriers for the voter such as steep hills and major roads? Are there any convenient transport links?
- Size: Can it accommodate more than one polling station if required? If multiple polling stations are required, is the polling place ample enough to accommodate all voters going into and out of the polling stations, even where there is a high turnout?
- Suitability: is the building readily available in the event of any unscheduled elections? Is there any possibility that the building may be demolished as part of a new development? Is the building accessible to all those entitled to attend the polling place?
- Accessibility: Is the building accessible to all those entitled to attend the polling place?

#### 1.5.2 Current Issues

Longbenton Community College is due to undergo major refurbishment, and by May 2015 the site will not be accessible to use as a polling station. Alternative facilities have been considered and a potential alternative place identified. The proposal for the alternative polling place is as follows:

Longbenton Ward – to transfer the polling place in polling district CD from Longbenton Community College to the Community Building at St Bartholomew's and Stephen's Primary Schools, Goathland Avenue, Longbenton. It is envisaged that this will be a permanent move.

A map of the polling district and further information relating to the current and proposed polling place are set out in the Appendix.

Letters informing electors of this change will be sent out, and it will also be highlighted on the poll cards, sent out in April for the combined Parliamentary/Local Election to be held on 7 May 2015.

## 1.6 Decision options:

The following decision options are available for consideration by Council.

## Option 1

To agree to the recommendations, as set out in the Appendix.

#### Option 2

To request that officers undertake further work to identify an alternative proposal to the one submitted to Council and report back to the next Council meeting.

## 1.7 Reasons for recommended option:

Option 1 is recommended for the following reason:

Longbenton Community College is no longer available to use as a polling place, the use of the Community Building at St Bartholomew's and Stephen's Primary Schools will ensure that voters have a polling station which is accessible to all voters, and is well known within the community.
