1.1 Purpose:

The draft Protocol on use of Social Media by Members (the Protocol) was referred by the Council for consideration by the Members Support Group. The Members Support Group considered the Protocol on 1 July 2015 and supported its introduction. Council is requested to adopt the draft Protocol.

1.2 Recommendation(s):

It is recommended that Council approves the draft Protocol on the use of Social Media by Members set out in Appendix A to this report and refers the Protocol to the Elected Mayor for her consent in accordance with Article 15 of the Constitution.

1.3 Forward Plan:

Twenty eight days notice of this report has been given and it first appeared on the Forward Plan that was published on 23 March 2015.

1.4 Council Plan and Policy Framework

This report has no direct relevance to the Our North Tyneside Plan priorities.

1.5 Information:

- 1.5.1 At the Annual Council Meeting, the Council considered a report reviewing the operation of the Constitution and making recommendations to Council on ways in which it could be amended to ensure that it achieves its purpose as set out in Article 1.
- 1.5.2 One of the specific objectives of the annual review was to ensure the Constitution reflects all current statutory requirements and, where appropriate, current practice.

- 1.5.3 The report submitted to the Annual Council meeting proposed that a Protocol on the use of Social Media by Members be introduced into the Constitution. The Protocol along with the other proposals in relation to the Constitution were considered by the Constitution Task Group at its meeting on 22 April 2015.
- 1.5.4 At the Annual Council Meeting the draft Protocol was referred to the Members Support Group for further consideration.
- 1.5.5 The Members Support Group considered the draft Protocol at its meeting on 1 July 2015. Members discussed the document and agreed to recommend approval of the Protocol and to refer it back to Council.
- 1.5.6 Attached at Appendix A is the draft Protocol which has been approved by the Constitution Task Group and the Members Support Group. It is submitted for Council's approval.

1.6 Decision options:

The following decision options are available for consideration by Council:

- Option 1 Accept the recommendation and approve the Protocol;
- Option 2 Make amendments to the Protocol; or
- Option 3 Reject the Protocol.

Option 1 is the recommended option.

1.7 Reasons for recommended option:

- 1.7.1 Option 1 is recommended for the following reasons:
- 1.7.2 The proposals presented to Council have been scrutinised by the Constitution Task Group, which is the Authority's consultative body for any changes to the Constitution and its associated documents and have also been recommended for approval by the Members Support Group and are the recommendations of the Monitoring Officer, who has a duty under Article 16 of the Constitution to monitor and review the Constitution.
