1.1 Executive Summary:

Major modernisation work will take place on the Metro system in North Tyneside in 2016, as part of the ongoing 11-year programme of works being delivered by Nexus on behalf of the North East Combined Authority (NECA) to modernise the Tyne and Wear Metro infrastructure.

A presentation will be provided at the meeting to give detail of the proposed works.

1.5 Information

1.5.1 Metro modernisation programme

An 11-year programme of works is taking place to modernise the Tyne and Wear Metro infrastructure, including refurbished track, signalling and stations.

The Metro modernisation programme, delivered by Nexus on behalf of the NECA, commenced in 2010/11 and is to run until 2020/21. The programme is funded primarily from a specific capital grant from the Department for Transport, with a limited local contribution from the Integrated Transport element of the NECA's Local Transport Plan funding. This Metro modernisation work forms part of the NECA transport capital programme approved on an annual basis by the North East Leadership Board.

1.5.2 Work in North Tyneside in 2016

The northern loop of Metro through North Tyneside is now Nexus' highest priority for renewal: the rail and track bed were installed some time ago and the asset is now in relatively poor condition.

In 2016, major works are to take place on the section of line between Benton and Tynemouth. This is anticipated to include more than 7km of full track renewal and the installation of more than 2km of track drainage.

While this will ultimately result in smoother and more reliable journeys, carrying out these major works is expected to necessitate both some weekend closures and some longer-term line closures, with replacement bus services provided.

A presentation will be provided at the meeting to give detail of the proposed works.
