



THE PR19 CONTROLS

In PR19, Ofwat will set price controls for 6 separate parts of the water and sewerage business:



Note: PR19 sets the regulated price controls for 2020 to 2025


Ofwat assess Business Costs and use these to set the Regulatory Revenue Allowances and thus customer bills

PR19 CHANGES, ISSUES OUTSTANDING AND TIMETABLE


Key changes for PR19

- Two new price controls: Water Resources and Bioresources (Sewage Sludge)
- Information published to allow trading in both areas
- Clarification of role of Customer Challenge Groups
- Widening of evidence sources for customer engagement
- Non Household Retail market opened April 2017
- Ofwat draft guidance published July 2017
- **Issues still unresolved**
- Household Retail Competition awaiting Government decision
