4. Early Years Funding 2017/18 Final Decisions

Graham Cowie talked through the briefing outlining the current position of the Early Years Block 2016/17 and the allocation of funding for the 2017/18 Early Years Block

The table below sets out the Early Years Block allocations to North Tyneside under the new Early Years National Funding Formula

Schools Forum approved the 2017/18 North Tyneside Funding Formula for early years funding, at their December 2016 meeting. This formula sets out how the Early Years Block will be allocated during the forthcoming financial year. As discussed at the December Schools Forum, the Maintained Nursery School allocation has been set at £17,638.

Questions

Colleagues asked if there is an indication of how many schools will be offering the additional hours and what will the implications this will have on budgets. GC replied that numbers are not known as yet. Work is still ongoing with Governors to determine which schools will offer the additional hours.

5. High Needs Funding 2017/2018 Final Decisions

ML talked through a briefing note provided on behalf of the SEND Working Group as requested by Forum to make specific recommendations to address funding pressures in 2017-18. The paper reflects the recent discussions at the SEND Working Group, sets out the forecast outturn for the High Needs Block in 2016-17 and highlights emerging issues for 2017-18.

Questions

Colleagues asked how the surplus amount has increased.

ML replied that this is linked to the forecast level of clawback and a reduced forecast level of call on top up. Also as a result of the work that has been undertaken during the last two vears.

It was confirmed that as part of the Government's realignment exercise this has seen a shift in resources to the High Needs Block, to match the decisions previously taken at

Colleagues noted that we need to be mindful that places have been increased in Special Schools.

Colleagues discussed and reaffirmed the decision to pay the 2015/16 residual deficit on the High Needs Block back over two years.

ML confirmed that any surplus not used can be moved back into main fund.

Recommendations

Forum were asked to:

- Note the estimated residual balance at the end of the respective financial years Agreed
- 2. Agree the transfer of funds to the High Needs Block from the Schools Block for the residual High Needs deficit balance.

6. Schools Funding 2017/18 including centrally retained and de-delegated items – Final Decisions

EA talked through the Briefing note which is in 4 sections, the purpose of which is to:

 To inform Schools Forum of the 2017/18 Local Government Finance Settlement in respect of the Dedicated Schools Grant 2. To determine with Schools Forum the centrally retained budgets for 2017/18

Colleagues asked for clarification of the amount charged for a single national license EA confirmed that this amount is top sliced by the DfE and is non negotiable, however it is more cost efficient for the licenses to be purchased in this way and will be picked up during individual budget monitoring

- 3. To inform Schools Forum of the draft mainstream formula prior to submission on 20 January 2017 and the movement between funding Blocks, which confirms the High Needs budget for 2017/18.
- 4. To determine with Schools Forum the de-delegated budgets for 2017/18. Colleagues noted that the figures given at Forum (7th Dec 17) for schools in financial difficulty, that were taken to area Headteachers for consultation are not the same as the revised figures circulated yesterday making it difficult to vote without the area Headteachers being made aware of the revised figures.

It was agreed that an electronic vote would be taken from members eligible to vote at this meeting.

- 3. Confirm the approval of the new ESG arrangements.

- 5. Subject to changes arising from Recommendations 2 and 3 above, approve the budget option as set out in Section 3 and agree that school budgets are progressed accordingly to meet EFA 20th January 2017 This vote will be open to School Members plus representatives of the Early Years providers.

- Approve the de-delegated items as set out in Section 4 and Appendix B (below).

Budget to support mainstream maintained schools in financial difficulty to be taken as an electronic vote after those members eligible to vote have re-consulted with their area Headteachers if they wish.
