Response from the Chief Executive of Northumbria Healthcare Foundation Trust - we have taken the opportunity to seek feedback from senior A&E consultants and nurses about the IDVA pilot which ended March 2013. It is clear that staff viewed the role as a valued resource, both in terms of staff education and direct support to patients. Nursing staff in particular expressed that their knowledge and awareness of domestic violence issues has significantly improved as a result of the pilot. However, making such a post a permanent fixture will require discussion and support from our CCG.	Accept	The Trust will discuss this with the CCG.
