Financial Benefits

The proposal involves the creation of 8 dwellings. The Government pays New Homes Bonus to local authorities to assist them with costs associated with housing growth and payments were first received in the financial year 2011/12. The payments are based on the net addition to the number of dwellings delivered each year, with additional payments made to encourage bringing empty homes back into use, and the provision of affordable homes. Granting consent for new dwellings therefore increases the amount of New Homes Bonus, which the Council will potentially receive.

As the system currently stands, for North Tyneside, for the new increase in dwellings built in 2016/17, the Council will receive funding for the six years from 2018/19. It should be noted, however, that the Government are currently reviewing the operation of the New Homes Bonus Scheme, including reducing the numbers of years for which payments are made. This was outlined in the Government Consultation paper "New Homes Bonus: sharpening the incentive: technical consultation", which they issued in December 2015. This Consultation closed on 10 March 2016, and the Government are yet to report their findings.

In addition, the units will bring in revenue as a result of Council tax.

Members should give appropriate weight amongst all other material considerations, to the benefit accrued to the Council as a result of the monies received from central government.
