Summary of allegation

The complainant, Mrs N Redfearn, alleges that Councillor Miller:

- in a political leaflet entitled "Intouch", promoted and published in relation to the Monkseaton North Ward election that was held on 22 May 2014 Councillor Miller made statements that are misleading and untrue. These statements relate to a number of matters including plans by the Labour administration to:
 - a) close middle schools;
 - b) build 5500 houses at Murton;
 - c) close Marden Bridge Sports Centre; and
 - d) close Whitley Bay Police Station.

It is alleged that the statements in relation to these matters because they are untrue bring the Authority into disrepute.

2. that the political leaflet contains comments about the complainant that are highly critical of her and the way in which she conducts, as the Elected Mayor, the business of the Authority. She alleges that these comments fail to treat her with respect.

Exclusion Resolution not passed – Public Document Relevant Paragraph(s) of the Code of Conduct

The relevant paragraphs of the Code are:

- Paragraph 1: You must treat others with respect, including Council officers and other elected members.
- Paragraph 4: You must not conduct yourself in a manner which could reasonably be regarded as bringing the Council or your office as a Member of the Council into disrepute.

Findings of fact in the Investigating Officer's report that are disagreed

Councillor Miller has not disagreed with any of the findings of fact details in the Investigating Officers report. Councillor Miller has express concern over the interpretation of the facts in the report. Councillor Miller's response to the Investigating Officer's report is attached to the Pre-Hearing Process Summary.

Attendance at the hearing (including representatives)

Councillor Miller will not be present at the hearing. He has stated that he does not wish to participate in the hearing as he does not consider it will be a "fair judgement given the Labour majority on the panel." Councillor Miller has not appointed a representative to attend the hearing on his behalf.

Mr Keith-Lucas, the Investigating Officer will be present at the hearing. He will be presenting his report.

None. No witnesses have been called by either Councillor Miller or the Mr Keith-Lucas.
